

## REPORT FOR The MONTH (OCTOBER - December 2010 )



Shalom! I would like to take this opportunity to appreciate the extensively effort made by you and committed Christian donors from the USA for a spiritual and physical well being of this organization "Operation Nehemiah Mission International" the help you have given us and also the effort we made here and all in all with the guidance and help of God we have tried to settle up some few problems which tend to bring down the strength and the progress of the organization.

**I therefore would like to go in to details of what we have achieved in the past month, these includes the followings;**

We purchased a set of four (4) solar powder batteries which cost us worth \$1,200 and the reason why we bought the batteries is because the first batteries are not suitable for solar and it developed some problems that it cannot store power for running the radio when sun sets it only work well when there is sun shining, that made us to arrange and buy new set of powder batteries. This money is generated from here with help of advertisement made on Nehemiah Trumpet Call Gospel radio for different clients. We only air advertisements which don't conflict and undermine the family or the Gospel

We also managed to buy a phone for our guard on Gordon hill, the reason why we have to buy the phone is that

we have experienced a lot of communication problems with them incase when we need them to put on the power on Gordon or put it off and as well it is not easy for them to communicate to us in case of any emergency, to that has forced us to buy the phone to easy the communication barriers which cost as 100 USD.

- We also managed to pay off the labor cost for the person who came to do the connection of the new batteries which we have bought to replace the old one's and it cost us worth 600 USD to pay the technician.



- We also managed to acquire an internet modem worth 120 USD which we can now use for communication as well as updates. We have successfully established Internet connection here at Nehemiah Mission headquarters in Beth Israel – Borongole to ensure that we can send and receive report from you and to you on time.

- We managed to solve some few problems in the radio department especially the studio equipments like a wireless microphone and headphones which both cost worth 200 USD. Back here in Borongole we use to experience a lot of power disturbances so this made us to struggle to buy a petrol generator worth 1200 USD which can then make the radio been started very early in the morning before solar gets heated and late after when sun sets because the batteries are

of the same type like the which is replaced from Gordon, therefore we are yet looking forward in how to also replace these ones.

- Our agents, two gentlemen raised complaints to our office about transport problem, we sat and came up with a solution that we should buy a bicycle for them and it is already purchased for the agents to sort out the transport problems which cost 100 USD. They go into community to collect letters and testimonies which needed to be aired on the radio.

- **In the Agriculture department the followings are activities going on.**

First and foremost we want to thank Brother John MacLean for bearing with us. We want to acknowledge everything he has done to help us move forward with agricultural production in the past two years. In 2010, We have received the donation of \$17000 and subsequent gift of \$9000 to deal with the road condition leading into Beth Israel farmland. We request that he continues to bear with us. We have seen a lot of progress in the field and also some setbacks this year due to heavy rainfall which made the road to the farmland

impassable. We also lost part of the field to flooding. A lot of cassava rotted under the ground because of too much water. From the previous projected report from Okang Wilson in Jan, 2010, the 15 acres of cassava could have generated 90,000, 000 Ugandan shillings which is equivalent of \$50,000 if all goes well according to plan in the fall of 2010. Instead, of harvesting, we spent a lot of time fixing the road .



We have not tested the competition in the market yet because we have not fully began selling the cassava in Juba and in various places in the country. The cassava sales is getting started since the rain has stopped, what delayed the cassava sales is only that the farm is not accessible because the rain was too much that when we tried last time the vehicle got stuck but we brought it to the compound, some we are getting started with the cassava sales.
